<p>What is the overall deductible?</p>	<p>\$500 individual / \$1,000 family Out-of-network (OON): \$1,000 individual/\$2,000 family</p>	<p>You must pay all the costs up to the deductible amount before the policy begins to pay for covered services you use, with the exceptions of office visit copays and for federally required preventive services. The deductible starts over with each plan year beginning on January 1st. See the chart starting on page 2 for your costs for services this plan covers.</p>
<p>Are there services covered before you meet your deductible?</p>	<p>Yes. Preventive care and primary care services are covered before you meet your deductible.</p>	<p>This plan covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the deductible amount. But a copayment or coinsurance may apply. For example, this plan covers certain preventive services without cost-sharing and before you meet your deductible. <p>What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan?</p>	<p>Durable Medical Supplies (DME): \$500 per individual (in-network only) Prescription drug: Level 1 and 2: \$600 individual / \$1,200 family Level 4: \$1,200 individual / \$2,400 family</p>	<p>The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay during a coverage period (usually one year) for your share of the cost of covered services. This limit helps you plan for health care expenses. The federal maximum out-of-pocket is \$8,150 individual/\$16,300 family. This applies to all essential health benefits, including some services not included in the out-of-pocket limit. <p>What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit?</p>	<p>Copays for Level 3 and Level 4 non-preferred specialty drugs; coinsurance paid by adults for hearing aids, premiums and health care this plan doesn't cover.</p>	<p>Even though you pay these expenses, they do not count toward the out-of-pocket limit.</p>

Do you need a referral to see a specialist ?	No, you don't need a referral to see a specialist	You can see the specialist you choose without permission from the health plan. However, you should get a referral to an orthopedist or neurosurgeon for low back pain.

This is not a cost estimator. Treatments shown are just examples of how this [plan](#) might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your [providers](#) charge, and many other factors.
